EMERGENCY RESPONSE

The Roma Education Fund has relocated 88,176 EUR from the budget of the "EU Regional Action for Increasing Education" and Employment Opportunities for Roma Youth in Western Balkans and Turkey" (RARE project) in an emergency response to Covid-19 crisis. The relocations are equal to 48,6 % of the total grant budget for the school year 2019/20 in all 7 project countries (Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Kosovo*, Montenegro, North Macedonia, Serbia and Turkey).
